

MEMORANDUM

TO: Chautauqua County Legislators

DATE: May 15, 2020

RE: Expected Budget Revenue Shortfalls due to COVID-19 Pandemic

The current COVID-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic in the State of New York has resulted in an unprecedented economic impact to all businesses and public entities, including Chautauqua County. On March 15, 2020, a State of Emergency was declared in Chautauqua County in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Governor Andrew Cuomo has issued and continues to issue Executive Orders directing actions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic in New York State.

Section 6(a) of Local Law 2-04 of the County of Chautauqua, and a corresponding provision in the Chautauqua County Administrative Code, provide that if at any time during the fiscal year it appears that the revenues available will be insufficient to meet the amounts appropriated in the annual budget, the County Executive shall report to the County Legislature the estimated amount of the deficit, remedial action taken by him or her, and recommendations as to further action.

Because the COVID-19 pandemic is ongoing, the impact on County revenues is difficult to predict, but it is safe to say that the County's budgeted sales tax revenue, occupancy tax revenue, and State aid will all be substantially reduced. In response, and in consultation with the County Legislature's leadership, I have taken the following remedial actions over the past month to offset the expected revenue shortfalls arising from the COVID-19 pandemic:

- 1. Instituted a hiring freeze for other than essential positions;
- 2. Eliminated the use of overtime unless related to the COVID-19 response;
- 3. Suspended the purchase of new equipment or leases, unless necessary to keep staff working or to respond to COVID-19;
- 4. Required that all purchases over \$5,000 be approved by the Budget Director, and that department heads reduce purchases under \$5,000 to the extent possible;

- 5. Began tracking of all incremental expenditures related to COVID-19 for potential reimbursement from FEMA;
- 6. Eliminated all unnecessary travel, including commitments for future discretionary travel, such as conferences;
- 7. Directed department heads to delay any non-essential spending and contracts for services, and to carefully monitor Federal and State funded programs for possible aid reductions;
- 8. Obtained plans for reductions in local share operations from each County department, and pre-filed for the County Legislature's May meeting a 2020 budget amendment resolution to offset over \$4 million in expected revenue shortfalls; and
- 9. Negotiated a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with CSEA Local 6300 dated today, May 15, 2020, to implement voluntary furloughs to achieve necessary reductions in budgeted expenses as an alternative to layoffs. When the savings from the furloughs are quantified, additional 2020 budget amendments will be presented reflecting the reduction in personnel expenses.

I look forward to continuing to work with the County Legislature, department heads, elected officials, and union leadership to take all steps necessary to confront the ongoing public health, economic, and County budget impacts from COVID-19. We will also be continuing our ongoing communication and consultation with the Governor's office, our State representatives, our Congressman, our neighboring counties, and NYSAC.

TITLE: Request for New York Forward Re-Opening Advisory Board Reporting

AT THE REQUEST OF: Chairman Pierre Chagnon

WHEREAS on March 7, 2020 Governor Andrew Cuomo issued a State of Emergency declaration in response to COVID-19 in New York State, and on March 20, 2020 issued an executive order "NYS on PAUSE" that closed 100 percent of non-essential businesses statewide; and

WHEREAS, New York's economy has been virtually shut down for over one month, with millions of individuals unemployed and tax revenue drastically decreasing; and

WHEREAS, a gradual and regional-based re-opening plan is needed to safely and effectively re-open New York's economy; and

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2020 Governor Cuomo established a statewide committee of business leaders, labor unions, education and industry groups to help guide the reopening process for New York's economy; and

WHEREAS, there are over 100 individuals serving on the New York Forward Re-Opening Advisory Board, and eight representatives from Western New York, including Kim Pegula, Pegula Sports and Entertainment; Jeremy Jacobs Jr., Delaware North; Dr. Katherine S. Conway-Turner, President of SUNY Buffalo State; Rene F. Jones, M&T Bank; Brenda W. McDuffie, Buffalo Urban League and Erie County Industrial Development Agency; Leecia R. Eve, Verizon; Nicole Wegman, Wegmans Food Markets; Clotilde Perez-Bode Dedecker, Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo; and

WHEREAS, the Advisory Board should keep municipalities informed and a part of their deliberations in order to gain valuable local input and increase transparency; now therefore be it

KNOWN, That this Honorable Body requests that all reports and media releases from the New York Forward Re-Opening Advisory Board be forwarded to the Chautauqua County Legislature to be entered into the public record; and be it further

MOVED, That the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward certified copies of this Motion to Governor Andrew Cuomo, Co-Chairs of the New York Forward Re-Opening Advisory Board Steven Cohen and William Mulrow, WNY delegation of the State Senate and Assembly, including Senator George Borrello, Assemblyman Andrew Goodell, and all others deemed necessary and proper.

CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY MOTION NO. ____-20

TITLE: Calling on Congress to Provide Direct Aid to Local Governments

AT THE REQUEST OF: Chairman Chagnon, Legislators Gould, Nazzaro and Odell:

WHEREAS, the largest single source of revenue for many counties in New York State is sales tax, and counties such as Chautauqua rely on the economic activity of a strong tourist industry and the substantial occupancy tax that is generated by that industry; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Association of Counties predicts that counties across New York State will face revenue shortfalls in excess of two billion dollars from lost sales and occupancy taxes, gaming revenue, and other fees as a consequence of the social distancing measures necessary to stop the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic counties are facing unprecedented fiscal stress as revenue has plummeted at the same time that counties are experiencing record demand for services; and

WHEREAS, County Health Departments, Emergency Response Departments, 911, Office for Aging Services and many other County departments and agencies are on the front lines in the fight against COVID-19 and are extending every possible resource to help flatten the curve, save lives and return our County to normal operation as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, the healthy function of our democratic society depends on effective and responsive local government in order to provide necessary services and resources; and

WHEREAS, the NYS Division of Budget has announced that budget shortfalls resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic could result in cuts of up to 50% in State aid to local governments, and the Executive Summary of the NYS FY 2021 Enacted Budget Plan states that "The scope and depth of the reductions to local aid programs needed to balance the FY 2021 Budget have no precedent in modern times" and that "In the absence of Federal aid, nearly every activity funded by state government in the aid to localities budget ... will face steep cuts"; and

WHEREAS, local property taxpayers cannot absorb the cost of this loss of these revenues and predicted state aid cuts; and

WHEREAS, the dissolution or bankruptcy or disintegration of our local governments is clearly undesirable and a threat to public good; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 748 Corona Virus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES) has not yet provided any direct aid to local governments; and

WHEREAS, New York State Residents paid \$22 billion more to the Federal Government than they got back in Federal spending in 2019, and more than \$116 billion over the past four years; and

WHEREAS, New York pays more to the Federal Government than the next two largest donor states combined; now therefore be it

KNOWN, That as Congress negotiates the next COVID-19 response package, the Chautauqua County Legislature calls on our United States Congressional Representatives to demand direct assistance to County and Local Governments; and be it further

MOVED, That the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward copies of this Motion to Senators Charles E. Schumer and Kirsten Gillibrand, Congressman Tom Reed and all others deemed necessary and proper.
