TITLE: Authorize County to Apply for Grants on Behalf of the North Chautauqua Lake Sewer District for an Inflow and Infiltration Study

BY: Public Facilities and Audit & Control Committees:

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, North Chautauqua Lake Sewer District (NCLSD) infrastructure was initially installed in the 1950's and 1970's, and much of the NCLSD's collection system infrastructure has not been updated or repaired since that time; and

WHEREAS, old infrastructure is likely to have cracks and leaks, which can lead to infiltration and inflow (I & I) of storm and ground water into, and leakage of sewage out of, collection system pipes; and

WHEREAS, sewage leaking out of pipes can result in an improper discharge of sewage to the ground, and such sewage can migrate to Chautauqua Lake; and

WHEREAS, storm and ground water entering into collection system pipes is unnecessarily processed through a treatment plant; and

WHEREAS, studies of the Orchard Terrace and Chautauqua Shores regions of the district showed numerous areas in need of repair to eliminate I & I, and studies of the remaining collection system infrastructure is needed to identify additional areas in need of repair; and

WHEREAS, grant funds provide an opportunity to significantly leverage local resources, and available grants include the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation / Environmental Facilities Corporation's Wastewater Infrastructure Engineering Planning Grant (EPG), which provides reimbursement for up to 80% of the cost of a water quality improvement study with a maximum award of \$30,000.00, with applicants providing the remaining local match contribution of at least 20% of the total grant award; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Development (CCPD), the Chautauqua Lake and Watershed Management Alliance (Alliance), and the North Chautauqua Lake Sewer District periodically partner on EPG funding assistance grant applications for I & I studies; and

WHEREAS, the estimated project budget for an I & I study is \$36,000, for which \$30,000 will be sought in grant funding, with the NCLSD committing to a minimum cash match of \$6,000; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County and of district users to apply for grant assistance when available, and when supported by the administrative heads of the districts; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is authorized to submit applications in the years 2021-2023 for a NYS EPG program grant on behalf of NCLSD for funding assistance for a NCLSD Board-approved I & I study, to execute related documents, and to represent the County in connection with such funding applications; and be it further

RESOLVED, That if a grant is awarded, the County Executive is authorized to execute and submit the necessary contract and associated documents to secure grant funds, and to represent the County in all matters related to the project and state grant assistance.

TITLE: Authorize County to Apply for Grants on Behalf of the Portland Pomfret Dunkirk Sewer District for Inflow and Infiltration (I&I) Studies

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, Portland Pomfret Dunkirk Sewer District (PPDSD) infrastructure was initially installed in the 1930's, 1950's and 1980's, and much of the District's collection system infrastructure has not been updated or repaired since that time; and

WHEREAS, old infrastructure is likely to have cracks and leaks, which can lead to infiltration and inflow (I & I) of storm and ground water into, and leakage of sewage out of, collection system pipes; and

WHEREAS, sewage leaking out of pipes can result in an improper discharge of sewage to the ground, and such sewage can migrate to Lake Erie; and

WHEREAS, storm and ground water entering into collection system pipes is unnecessarily processed through a treatment plant; and

WHEREAS, New York State has available grant funds, that can be used to identify locations at which I & I problems have developed, and can provide an opportunity to significantly leverage local resources; and

WHEREAS, available grants include the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) / Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) Wastewater Infrastructure Engineering Planning Grant (EPG) which provides reimbursement for up to 80% of the cost of a water quality improvement study with a maximum award of \$30,000.00, with applicants providing the remaining local match contribution of at least 20% of the total grant award; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Development (CCPD) and the Portland Pomfret Dunkirk Sewer District (PPDSD) partner on EPG funding assistance grant applications; and

WHEREAS, the estimated project budget for an I & I study is \$36,000, for which \$30,000 will be sought in state grant funding, with the PPDSD committing to a minimum cash match of \$6,000; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County and of District users to apply for grant assistance when available, and when supported by the administrative heads of the Districts; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is authorized to submit applications in the years 2021-2023 for EPG grants on behalf of the PPDSD for funding assistance for District-approved I & I studies, to execute related documents, and to represent the County in connection with such funding applications; and be it further

RESOLVED, That if a grant is successful, the County Executive is authorized to execute and submit the necessary contract and associated documents to secure grant funds, and to represent the County in all matters related to the project and state grant assistance.

WHEREAS, Marvin Troyer & Sons Lumber, 2059 Clymer-Sherman Road, Clymer, NY 14724 submitted the highest bid with an amount of \$10,250; and

WHEREAS, the total sale amount payable to Chautauqua County is \$10,250 and pursuant to Resolution 164-02, revenue from the sale of timber rights will be dedicated to the capital improvements of the County Parks system; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to accept the bid submitted by Marvin Troyer & Sons Lumber, as the offered price exceeds the fair market appraisal; now, therefore be it

TITLE: Authorize Agreement with NY State DOT for Performance of Federal-Aid Project PIN 5762.56

BY: Public Facilities and Audit & Control Committees:

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, the painting of bridges with BINS 3324170, 3324790, and 3367230 (the Project) is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, which calls for the apportionment of the costs of such program, now estimated to be \$315,000, to be \$252,000 Federal funds, \$47,250 State Marchiselli funds, and \$15,750 Local funds; and

WHEREAS, the County of Chautauqua desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the Non-Federal share of the costs of the Project (PIN 5762.56); and

WHEREAS; the local share is currently calculated to be \$15,750 and can be covered with existing funding in organization D.5112.390; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua hereby approves the above-subject Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, That the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua hereby authorizes the County of Chautauqua to pay in the first instance 100% of the Federal and Non-Federal shares of the cost of the Project or portions thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, That in the event the full federal and nonfederal share costs of the Project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the County of Chautauqua shall convene its Legislature as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the New York State Department of Transportation thereof; and it is further

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) has awarded \$193,463.00 to Chautauqua County though multiple agencies included in the Gun Involved Violence Elimination ("GIVE") Task Force to reduce gun violence, drug offenses, and other violent crimes in the primary jurisdiction of the City of Jamestown and as well as throughout Chautauqua County; and

WHEREAS, the funded GIVE partnership consists of the City of Jamestown Police Department, and the Chautauqua County agencies of the District Attorney, Office of the Sheriff and the Probation Department; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jamestown Police Department has been awarded \$72,221.00 of the total GIVE funding and will sign and administer a separate contract with the New York State DCJS for its portion of said funding; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County agencies will share the balance of such funds as follows: the District Attorney's office \$83,306.00; the Chautauqua County Office of the Sheriff \$27,436.00; and the Probation Department \$10,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the offices of the District Attorney, Sheriff and Probation have included a portion of these grant funds in their 2021 Adopted Budgets, with the balance to be included in their proposed 2022 budgets; now, therefore be it

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 178-11, the Lake Erie Management Commission (LEMC) was created by the Chautauqua County Legislature to prioritize and select Lake Erie watershed projects for funding; seek additional funding for Lake Erie watershed projects; and undertake such other initiatives and coordination activities for the betterment of the Lake Erie watershed; and

WHEREAS, over the last ten years, the LEMC has effectively identified, prioritized, and recommended and delivered 2% Occupancy Tax Funding to stakeholders and municipalities in the Lake Erie Watershed; and

WHEREAS, Barcelona Harbor is located on Lake Erie and within the Town of Westfield, and is economically important to the Town of Westfield, Chautauqua County, and Western New York; and

WHEREAS, historically high Lake Erie water levels and severe weather events during 2019 and 2020 caused Barcelona Harbor's breakwaters to be overtopped by damaging waves; and

WHEREAS, tens of thousands of cubic yards of sediment and storm debris were deposited within the Federal Navigation Channel of Barcelona Harbor, rendering it useless as a Harbor of Refuge on the Great Lakes Navigation System, and severely diminished for recreational boating and sport fishing; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District is actively working to identify funding to restore the full functionality of Barcelona Harbor; however, it is unlikely that a federally funded dredging project can be implemented in 2021; and

WHEREAS, The Town of Westfield approached the LEMC with a plan to obtain the proper permits and to utilize shared services and rental equipment to dredge approximately 5,000 cubic yards of sediment from Barcelona Harbor's inlet to ensure that the harbor is accessible and usable for recreational boating and sportfishing in 2021; and

WHEREAS, On March 15, 2021, the LEMC unanimously approved a resolution to cofund the Town of Westfield's local effort to dredge the inlet of Barcelona Harbor at a cost not to exceed \$20,000; and

WHEREAS, using 2% Occupancy Tax Funding, capital project H.8020.37011 Lake Erie Mgmt Comm (2020) was created to facilitate projects consistent with the goals of the LEMC, and the capital project has a budget of \$62,522; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature authorizes the use of up to \$20,000 from capital project H.8020.37011 to reimburse the Town of Westfield for dredging costs in Barcelona Harbor; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized to establish accounts and enter into any and all agreements necessary to implement the terms of this resolution.
