Chairman Chagnon: Okay that brings us to Announcements. Are there any Announcements from the Legislator for the good of the order? Any Announcements? Quiet group tonight. Announcements going once, going twice. That's brings us to the second privilege of the floor.

### PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Chairman Chagnon: Members of the public may comment on any subject. A member of the legislature may speak on any subject. Individual comments are limited to 3 minutes and

comments representing a group shall be limited to 5 minutes. Is there anyone wishing to address the second privilege of the floor? Please introduce yourself and your address.

Yes, Mel McGinnis, Frewsburg New York. Addressing the Chairman and the Legislature as the spokesperson for the Southern Tier Tea Party Patriots. Pharma funded main street media has convinced millions of Americans that Dr. Fauci is a hero. He is anything but, those aren't my words, but the words of Liberal Democrat, Robert F. Kennedy Jr. As you will receive the documentation in the work, The Real Dr. Fauci RFK Jr. unearthed a shocking story that obliterates the media spin on Dr. Fauci. It alarms every American Democrat and Republican who cares about our Constitution, the future of our health and the health of our youth. Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

Kathy Abbate, Ashville, New York. Good evening, I'm thankful for the Tea Party for making it possible for you to receive a #1 best seller book that has a lot of documentation in it on Amazon. It's a New York Times, Wall Street Journal, USA Today and Publishers Weekly National best seller and that is without any kind of media help. This book has exhausted research to reveal all the evidence against Anthony Fauci and the organizations that he has been associated with. There is reason that the media is silent on this book and that there has not been 1

person to try to bring a lawsuit against Robert F. Kennedy Jr. for writing it. That is because it is true and it can't be debunked. I employ you to read it and to begin to understand what we are really dealing with here not only in the US but in the world. When you read the book and after you read the book, please contemplate what you will do as a legislator to help keep our republic and our constitutional freedoms intact. This book is an incredible book. There are other books coming out and it has honest, truthful and factual information. He has thousands of citations in it so please read it, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

My name is Marsha Johnson, I live in Fredonia and I represent the Climate Reality Project Chautauqua Chapter. There have been many criticisms of solar energy in our county and I will address some of these. As has been discussed in this body and other local governments, the end of life cycle for solar panels presents a unique problem. Putting them in landfills is not a solution. They contain toxic chemicals like silicon, cadmium and lead that can leach into the ground. Some have tried to imply to this and other government bodies that there is no solution. Recycling is the answer. According to Discover Magazine, First Solar, America's largest solar company has facilities that can extract 90% of the materials in the panels which then are recycled back to new solar panels or electronics. Other companies around the world are developing solar recycling plants. Waste from end of life solar panels presents opportunities to recover valuable materials and create jobs through recycling. According to the International Renewable Energy Agency, by 2030, the cumulative value of recoverable raw materials from end of life panels globally with be about 450 million dollars which is equivalent to the cost of raw materials currently needed to produce about 60 million new panels. Governing bodies especially at the federal level need to adopt legislation for waste regulation of solar panels. They also need to put R&D money into studying the best methods for recycling. New technologies are always being developed that create more environmentally friendly products. Chautauqua County has suggested creating a Local Law that will provide information and guidance to localities when they are negotiating contracts with solar companies. This is a very commendable project to help ahead of the federal regulations. Another criticism being made of solar farms is that they take away farm land but no one is forcing farmers to use their land for solar. Most are not making enough money to survive in the agricultural sector. Do these critics propose forcing farmers to grow products on their property instead of leasing them to the solar companies, is that the American way? When one looks at the extreme weather the world has experienced in the last several years, there is no question that we need to reduce carbon admissions into our atmosphere. The number of major natural disasters almost doubled in the last 20 years from the previous year's according to the Union of Concerned Scientists. This resulted in millions of deaths and trillions of dollars in damage. Add to that the health effects, agricultural issues due to weather changes, droughts, melting glaciers, rising sea waters, just look at Miami.

Chairman Chagnon: You've exceeded your 3 minutes, please wrap it up.

Ms. Johnson: I am representing a group.

Chairman Chagnon: And which is what?

Ms. Johnson: The Climate Reality Project of Chautauqua County.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you.

Ms. Johnson: This resulted in millions of deaths and trillions of dollars in damage. Add to that the health effects, agricultural issues due to weather changes, droughts, melting glaciers, rising sea waters and extinction about plants and animals. Environmental migrants are at our boarders due to issues in Central America. We must move from fossil fuels to renewable energy while we still can. I commend the Chautauqua County IDA for their support of solar and encourage this Legislature to do so as well, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, next to address the 2<sup>nd</sup> privilege of the floor.

Hello my name is Ed Seleski(?) and I live in Panama and back to the book about Dr. Robert Kennedy Jr. This is one of several stories (inaudible) book and page 15. When the pandemic started mostly the medical practices in the Detroit area shut down. Dr. David Brownstein told me, quoting Dr. Brownstein, "I had a meeting with my staff and my 6 partners. I told them we were going to stay open and treat COVID. They wanted to know how. I said "We've been treating viral diseases here for 25 years and all that time our office had never lost a single patient to the flu or flu like illnesses." During early COVID we treated people in their cars with oral vitamins, A, C, E and Zinc. We administered IV solutions outside in the winter with IV vitamin C and Hydrogen Peroxide. We nebulized them with Hydrogen Peroxide and Lugol's Iodine. We used Ivermectin and Hydroxychloroquine. We treated 715 patients and had 3 hospitalizations and no deaths. Early treatment was the key. We weren't allowed to talk about it. The whole medical establishment was trying to shut down early treatment and silence all the doctors who talked about successes. A whole generation of doctors just stopped practicing medicine. When we talked about our success, the whole cartel came for us. I've been in litigation with the medical board for a year." Videos of Brownstein's recovered patients were removed. Brownstein and his 6 colleagues published a peer reviewed article describing their successes with early treatment. The FTC sent him a letter telling him to remove it. Doctor Brownstein said "No one wanted Americans to know that you didn't have to die from COVID, it's 99% treatable. We proved it, no one had to die". Meanwhile, we have seen lots of really bad vaccine side effects in our patients. 7 stroked, some ending in Paralysis, 3 pulmonary embolisms, 2 blood clot cases, 2 cases of Graves 'disease and 1 death, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. Next to address the 2<sup>nd</sup> privilege of the floor.

Good evening, my name is Kathy Kulfer(?) and I live in Jamestown in the Town of Ellicott. During my time on privilege of the floor, I would like to also cite another excerpt from the book, *The Real Anthony Fauci* by Robert Kennedy Jr. This is on page 17 "Dr. Ryan Colt is a male clinic and Columbia University trained board certified anatomic clinical pathologist and the CEO medical director of Cole diagnostics, the largest independent lab in Idaho. He has diagnosed more than 350 thousand patients in his career. Dr. Cole discovered Dr. Peter McCullough's research during his own investigation of early treatment remedies when his own overweight brother called Dr. Cole on his way to the emergency room with a positive PCR test, labored breathing, blood oxygen at 86 and chest discomfort that he rated 9 out of 10. Dr. Cole

directed his sibling to a local pharmacy and called in an Ivermectin prescription. "Within 6 hours, my brother's chest pain was down to 2 out of 10 due to the interferon effect of Ivermectin. Within 24 hours after Ivermectin, his oxygen was 98 and then he fully recovered". Since rescuing his brother, Dr. Cole has encountered many patients in early stages of the disease. "Almost none of them could find Dr.'s in the community to treat them. I intervened to provide early treatment to over 300 positive patients. Half of whom were comorbid and high risk. Of this cohort, none were hospitalized and none died." And then Dr. Cole continues "Early treatment of COVID, plain and simple, saves lives. If the medical profession had been forward thinking, hands on and focused on the disease with an early patient multi drug approach, knowing that COVID 19 is an inflammatory clotting disease, hundreds of thousands of lives could have been saved in the US. Never in the history of medicine says Dr. Cole has early treatment of any patient with any disease been so overtly neglected by the medical profession on such a massive scale to not treat is to do harm". Thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, next to address the second privilege of the floor.

My name is Jerry Ralph and I live in Mayville. I wasn't planning on speaking but I'm almost through with this book and some of it might scare you but I suggest you read it because I learned a lot and I think we all could. I think there's a lot of people out there these days that don't have the facts that are in this book that are listening to mainstream media, yahoo news, that sort of thing. A lot of us up here are researching and this is a compilation that is amazing. This is such an extensive bibliography that at the end of each chapter he has over 200 sources on many of these chapters. Just a couple things, I am almost through with it – I have 100 pages to go but – is an example. We've all heard of the- we remember the swine flu of 1976. Started with 1 GI at Fort Dicks, he died. It was projected by Fauci and others, 1 million deaths easy. At the end of the year it wasn't 1 million, it was 1, that GI. Another example, Bird Flu 2005. Fauci started in 2001 saying there was going to be a problem with Bird Flu. He said it was going to decimate the population. It started with a little girl who dug up her dead duck pet. She got it and she buried the duck again but she got it. Fauci said 150 million deaths – 282. I think a lot of us are subject to fear (inaudible) there's a lot of it out there and I think if you read this book, you are never going to look at the W.H.O., the CDC, Fauci, and Bill Gates in the same light that you do tonight. Fauci, in my book is an absolute murderer. I think you'll enjoy the book and in a positive way it's enlightening but it is scary, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, next to address the second privilege of the floor.

Good Evening, my name is Susan Baldwin and I live in Villenova, New York - Chautauqua County and I am here because about 4 months ago I came in and I showed you photos of my water – that sparkling water that I had that looked like atomic water. Well I had that tested and that was Promium, Strontium, lead, arsenic, methane and a huge amount of salt. So then I had my daughters well tested – she lives 2 miles away from me. I would say then maybe the aquifer would go that far and it did. With their stimulus check, they bought a brand new washing machine. This, and I'd like you to notice it, is a greasy, globby, nasty, thick substance. That's the drain right there, not the drain, the inlet to her water. It is greasy. My son-in-law took a screw driver, you see that here in this photo, it is a bit blurry I'm sorry for that but that's a screwdriver there going into that washing machine entrance – you know, where the

screen should be and there should be maybe a couple of *(inaudible)*. He put it in a baggy for me. They've been fracking, hydro fracking in Villenova. On December 4<sup>th</sup>, between my house and her house is 2 miles away and there's a farm on North Hill Road. They had a water access faucet that went to the cattle. A couple of tractors, a little bit of fencing, chainsaw and a shed burned for 3 hours. It looked like a torch *(inaudible)* fire. I had texted that man about 2 weeks before that and told him "they're fracking on Villenova Road, right behind you." That shed was probably 100 feet from his home. He's getting new siding. He had no insurance and so he lost a couple of tractors, some fencing and some chainsaws. I know that was a *(inaudible)*. The newspapers said the reason for the fire was not going to be disclosed and so by a wild chance, my grandson is his daughter's friend, best friend and he said "oh boy was she scared that night of that explosion". So I just want you to all know I have contacted ErinBrockovich(?) about this because Chautauqua County has 800 wells permitted to hydro excavated, drill deeper or plug.

Chairman Chagnon: You've exceeded your 3 minutes, please wrap it up.

Ms. Baldwin: Alright, I'm sorry for exceeding it. Thank you for letting me talk and please be aware, that's what they're doing and it's ruining everybody's water in Chautauqua County. We all don't have city water, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

Gayle McKinney, Sinclairville, New York. I would like to make a little comment before I get into this about the windmill business. Those windmills need oil to operate, I have seen them leaking. They also, with their plugins for their cars, the electricity comes from natural gas to run the chargers. Just for your note, you need fossil fuels. Natural gas is one of the cleanest there is. Onto what I'm doing here, this is from the book *The Real Anthony Fauci (inaudible)*. This is from page 11, quoting from the book "I experienced my own personal frustrations with this bewildering policy said Robert F. Kennedy Jr". When in December 2020, I asked my 83 year old mothers physician to describe her treatment plan if she had a positive PCR. He told me there is really nothing we can do unless she starts having trouble breathing. Then we will send her to Mass General for ventilation. When I asked him about Ivermectin and Hydroxychloroquine, he shrugged his shoulders. He had never heard of their use in COVID patients. There is no early treatment for COVID he assured me. Dr. Fauci adopted this unprecedented protocol of telling doctors to let patients diagnosed with a positive COVID test go home untreated, leaving them in terror and spreading the disease until breathing difficulties force their return to hospitals". Sound familiar in Albany people? There, they faced 2 deadly remedies, remdesivir and ventilators. Thank you for your time.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. Anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

Hi, Cheryl Fiedler from Ellery and I also would like to read an excerpt from "The Real Anthony Fauci". I'm going to quote, there is a quote in there from Dr. Harvey Risch who is a professor of epidemiology at the Yale School of Public Health and School of Medicine just to give you some of his credentials. It's a very brief one and it's found on page 10, "Monoclonal

antibodies work great but they're not suitable for outpatients because they are administered ID. It's therefore perfect for nursing homes. About 1/3 of COVID deaths occurred in the nursing homes and ALS across the US during the pandemic. Dr. Fauci should have equipped both nursing homes and quarantine hospitals with Monoclonal antibodies" said Dr. Risch. Instead he obstructed these institutions from administering that medicine. It was a kind of staggering, savage act of mal practice and negligence to deny this remedy to elder care facilities at a time when the elderly were dying at a rate of 10,000 per week and I brought this with – I'm currently reading it and it is eye opening. It is very eye opening and then the other thing I have just very briefly is someone gave me a copy of the (inaudible) report from last Friday and I'm just going to touch on a couple things because you can look it up yourself of course. As of that date, deaths from the COVID vaccination - 23,990, permanent disabilities - 43,476 and then there are several other things. Another one is the life threatening reports is 27,305 and it goes on. There are some alarming statistics for children of all ages, our young children and our teenagers and I'm sure many of you have heard about the myocarditis and the other comment I need to make as a grandma and great grandma is I plead with people to gather together and somehow we've got to get the masks off our children in school. I can speak, I know of one little boy, 4 years old, who moved up here from Pennsylvania. Very active, healthy little boy and of course he would get the sniffles and stuff but since they've moved into this area and he has to wear a mask to school every day in pre-k he's got congestion and coughing and it seems like he comes home all the time - of course he – 4 years old, he has a very bacteria covered little mask and god only knows what's on these masks.

Chairman Chagnon: You've exceeded your 3 minutes, please wrap it up.

Mrs. Fiedler: I'm sorry, okay thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Next to address the second privilege of the floor.

My name is Carl Fiedler and I'm a resident of Ellery. That's my wife, she usually does the talking, same as home. I very rarely come to this but I've read this book. I'm retired and I have time to do so. It's very hard to read, there is 435 pages but what it is in our lifetime or in this moment is this what evil represents at the cost of lives. What they're doing is following the money and this is in this book. I'm not saying my struggles getting through high school so it isn't that I'm knowledgeable but in this book it will tell you, USA billionaires in their first year of 2020, first year of the pandemic, their incomes went up \$1.8 trillion and that's in this book. Ironic what small businesses lost and the one that closed \$1.7 trillion. Not million, billion but trillion and that is also in this book. If you take the time, I understand we can't give it to you because you can't receive gifts. We have that number here, we know the number of legislators but this is an informal piece of work that it seemed like it could be acquired by you without saying that it's a gift. And I would read this – I've read it almost twice – I took notes from it over 4 pages. My wife tested me and I went over 6 minutes. There was so much in there that I really couldn't cut it down to 3 minutes so I didn't for that reason I didn't bring it with me but have highlighted and outlined with pen and pencil and yellow highlighter almost every page in this book because it is so informal. When you get to the part that we lost possibly out of the 131 million residents of USA residents, we possibly lost 500,000 needlessly. That's so sad that if they didn't catch it at 5 or 7 days and Ivermectin is 2 cents a pill and (inaudible) is 12 cents per

course. Remdesivir is charge of that patient \$3,000, that's where Fauci and Bill Gates of 20 years (inaudible). I appreciate the time, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. Anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

Carol Winham(?), District 15 West Ellicott. I want to read a quote here "My friend, have you ever been in a quarantine city? Then you cannot realize what you are asking me to do. To place such a curse on San Francisco would be worse than 100 fires and earthquakes and I love this city too well to do her such a rightful hurt". That was said by Rupert Blue, public health service officer in charge of dealing with the 1907 plague outbreak. He subsequently served as 4<sup>th</sup> Surgeon General of the United States and President of the American Medical Association. So now let's compare Dr. Fauci's mismanagement of the pandemic. Statistics death rates per 1 million US-2,107. Iran-1,449. Sweden-1,444. Germany-1,126. Cuba-650. Jamaica-640. Denmark- 455. India- 327. Finland- 194. Vietnam- 197. Norway- 161. Japan 139. Pakistan- 128. Kenya- 97. South Korea- 47. Hong Kong- 28 and China- 3. The reason I'm shaking is because it upsets me to think we have needlessly lost people if we could have just offered therapeutics. Anyways, I don't understand how with all of the knowledge as a leading nation how we could be highest on this list. So I'm just asking people – I tell people this all the time, take your vitamin C, D3, zinc, we share it and those of us that have - I mean I'm overweight - I'm in the category of -I guess that I'm supposed to have been dead already and I'm not so I just ask people to look into this and I know that it's difficult because it's not on the mainstream media and again I apologize for not having my composure like I normally do but his is so upsetting to think of how many people that are being harmed by these vaccines and it seems like nobody wants to do anything and I don't understand as leaders. I look to our legislators to look into this and certainly protect our County and start putting the word out instead of vaccine stuff that our tax payers are doing just tell your friends, take these vitamins.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, anyone else for the second privilege of the floor?

Good evening my name is Lynn Bedford and I'm from Arkwright, New York. I'm a sitting member on the board there and I, as all of you, took an oath of office to uphold the Constitution of the United States of America and the State of New York. I represent the people of Arkwright. Not here tonight in that capacity but just to give you a background. I'm a seeker of the truth because I know that the truth will set me free from lies. I implore every member here and everyone in the gallery to read this book, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

My name is Ben Shank and I'm from French Creek. I guess what I want to recommend *(inaudible)* this is what I wanted to say - PJ Wendel got up there and he's talking about our County and the improvements and my brothers and sister citizens and servant representative. I could sit here and be critical but I know the difficulty of the job that you have and there's a lot of people that you need to serve and listen to and so I will commend you for your efforts. There's a book that I'm reading and this is what I wanted to – my main thing was - a book, it's a classic

and it was written in 1850 and the guy's name is Fredrick Bastiat. The book is called "The Law" and basically he was a Frenchmen in the time of the French Revolution where socialism was rapidly going into communism and so you see the reason why I'm recommending this book to my fellow representative citizens is that's the state that we are in today. We have been going into socialism for years by people that think themselves are more intelligent and better able to take care of people. Now you see that we are rapidly going into communism where we see people if you do not abide by what they think is the right way to go, there is a concentration camp for you and now today in New York State there is a sheriff by the name of Carpinelli who was quoted on video and he's running for governor and so it's not just some common man, this man is a sheriff and there is a lot of respect for him and he is questioning what the encampment is all about in New Platts, NY. I would recommend you think about that. We are rapidly going into communism. You see, God created man and man got together and had a family and they got more and more families and pretty soon we needed government to care for our rights that were given to us by God, not by man, not by government.

Chairman Chagnon: You've exceeded your 3 minutes, please wrap it up.

Mr. Shank: Okay, I just ask that you would read this book and that we would return to the foundation of our government that makes us a happy people, a healthy people and a free people.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. Anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

My name is Roy Harvey and I am from Mayville. (Inaudible) once said "it's easier to fool people than to convince them they had been fooled". Anthony Fauci has taken that (inaudible) to heart. Robert Kennedy's book, The Real Anthony Fauci, consists of 12 chapters, actually 15 chapters and 450 papers and it should eventually achieve a Nobel Prize. I'm very pleased to see that 4 of those chapters tell the Fauci story in the AIDS crisis of 1980 and early 1990's. Four of the chapters relate to Fauci's key role in that scan-demic. A brief personal story in the 1980's, I was an investigator with the Cook County's States Attorney's Office. There were 400 prosecutors' assistant attorneys and about 100 investigators. I was assigned to consumer fraud division. We were very concerned about AIDS. I was personally concerned because a friend of mine son was dying of AIDS and my next door neighbor who's a psychiatrist associated – employed with the Cook County hospital and his advice to his patients – and they were all patients who had AIDS, young men largely was just to accept your death and that was essentially the philosophy of the medical establishment that we observed and the consumer fraud and throughout Cook County. There's about 8 million people there. So I had our office subscribe to the CDC bulletin, it's an expensive thing, came out every week and we read it very carefully. We were looking to understand what was really going on with this thing because what Fauci was saying was this is a termination event. This was going to kill millions, billions of people throughout Europe, Africa and the whole world. Fauci was a major scaremonger in this thing and we read this CDC bulletin very carefully and all we saw on it was this one drug that was they put forth called AZT. AZT was scrapped as a drug by the pharmaceutical industry because it was so dangerous. Glaxosmithkline picked it up and said we can take this up and we can sell it as the cure for AIDS. Fauci was fine was that - Glaxosmithkline and a couple of others (inaudible) and they made millions of dollars. There were no tests going on and finally the AIDS community

was really alarmed at this because many of them were dying, many of the young men were dying and they pressured Fauci to do a test. You can see this thing and there's a film called the "Dallas Buyers Club" - it's Matthew McConaughey. It tells the story pretty well of Fauci's role in this thing. Finally the homosexual community, the AIDS community and those other people who got it through blood transfusions put pressure to have this AZT tested. The tests were totally phony, totally false.

Chairman Chagnon: You've exceeded your 3 minutes, please wrap it up.

Mr. Harvey: Alright, but anyway this is a very good book. We're essentially offering it to you as a documentation and that's what it is. It's seriously worth your consideration and we hope that you'll read it and we're going to be passing them out now, thank you.

Chairman Chagnon: Anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

Good evening everyone, Lisa Vanstrom, Plummer Avenue Jamestown, New York-Town of Ellicott, District 15. I just want to say best wishes and congratulations to the JCC swim team. They are going to be in Florida next week competing in the National Junior College championships so "Go Jayhawks".

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor? Anyone else?

Karen Engstrom, the Town of Chautauqua. We aren't able to read a review of Robert F. Kennedy Jr.'s book *The Real Anthony Fauci*. Bill Gates, Big Pharma and the Global War on democracy and public health because the corporate establishment pretends that it does not exist but it does exist and we're providing that documentation to you tonight, one and all. The Sheriff, the County Executive and all the Legislators of this body. The book was on the best seller list of the New York Times before it was available in book stores, it was also #1 on Amazon before it was in book stores. There is really a first in publishing history. A runaway best seller that isn't even mentioned in any major newspaper, TV or news program. There is complete censorship through silence but in spite of that, many thousands have bought the book and read it and shared it. It is a censorship that undermines our ability to make up our own minds. It tries to force us to accept the narrative dictated by the pharmaceutical industry, big tech and the federal government and most state governments. We present these books as a document for your edification, thank you very much.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you. Next to address the second privilege of the floor.

Good evening, Jim Quattrone, Jamestown, New York. Since Mrs. Vanstrom shared some good news I just wanted to share this, on June 5<sup>th</sup> of this year, Josh (?) and Justin (?) from the Special Olympics are heading to Orlando Florida to represent New York State in Special Olympics. They are trying to raise money for their trip and I think that's very worthy to bring up in front of this legislature and the people here so I'm proud of these 2 young men and encourage you – I think its March 5<sup>th</sup> they are having a curling contest down at the Jamestown ice area. I'm going to give my hand a try at curling for the first time so if anybody wants to come down there

and encourage these kids there (*inaudible*) some of us with some of the Special Olympic athletes that afternoon. So I just wanted to share that with everyone.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you, anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor?

Legislator Pavlock: Sometimes I'm a little slow but I would like to make a comment regarding all of our year end reconciliations. I'm not as specific as our former colleague, Mr. Nazzaro, to have a whole bunch of numbers written out right down to a T but I would like to just say thank you for all of the departments for the work that they did in their yearend reconciliations. A lot of them were able to balance their budgets within their own budget and use a lot of general fund money to do so, so I applaud the work that they did. Unfortunately, some of those funds that they did save was a lack of filling all of the positions of personnel so I hope moving forward that we can fill some of those vacancies and find the people but I just wanted to again thank the departments for being able to use funds within their departments to make all their yearend reconciliations.

Chairman Chagnon: Thank you Dan, well said. Anyone else wishing to address the second privilege of the floor? Legislator Bankoski?

MOVED by Legislator Bankoski, SECONDED by Legislator Harmon to adjourn.
