Brief Description of Proposed Action (include purpose or need): A 57-lot residential subdivision and two new commercial lots are proposed to be constructed in a 53.4-acre parcel of forested and brush-covered land within a rural/residential setting. The area is zoned as "Residential-Agricultural (R-A)" in the Town of Chautauqua. There is a federally-regulated wetland located centrally in the property, which will be preserved to provide stormwater control. Conservation easements will be established to permanently protect the wetland area and other natural features as shown on the design drawings. Green infrastructure practices such as vegetated swales, pocket wetlands, disconnecting rooftop runoff, and rain gardens are some examples of the techniques that will be used to control stormwater. The design will release stormwater runoff at the pre-developed rate and will not negatively impact downstream waterbodies.



**EVALUATION OF THE MAGNITUDE AND IMPORTANCE OF PROJECT IMPACTS &  
DETERMINATION OF SIGNIFICANCE**

**H&H Chautauqua Development, LLC a/k/a Mandolin Ridge Subdivision**

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**Date:** May 11, 2020

Pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617 pertaining to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law (State Environmental Quality Review [SEQR]), the Chautauqua Town Board, as SEQR Lead Agency, issues the following Findings:

**Name of Action:** H&H Chautauqua Development, LLC – Application for Subdivision Review

**Location:** Chautauqua-Stedman Road, Town of Chautauqua, Chautauqua County, New York

**Description of Action:**

Review of a subdivision proposal that would create 54 half-acre residential lots and 2 five-acre commercial building lots on a parcel located near the intersection of Route 394 and Chautauqua-Stedman Road, which is designated on the Chautauqua County tax map as Section 297.00, Block 1, Lot 49.1.

## **PURPOSE:**

This document is intended to supplement Part 3 of the Environmental Assessment Form and the determination made therein that the Project will result in no significant adverse environmental impact. It considers the relevant environmental impacts, facts, and conclusions included in Parts I and II of the Environmental Assessment Form, applies the Boardmembers' personal and individual knowledge of the Town of Chautauqua, and provides supporting reasons for the Board's determination of significance.

These Findings weigh and balance relevant environmental impacts with social, economic, and other considerations and provide a rationale for the Chautauqua Town Board's decision regarding potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed action. These Findings also certify that the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQR), codified as amended at Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, and the SEQR implementing regulations, have been met. They further certify that, consistent with social, economic, and other essential considerations, the action chosen is the alternative, from among the reasonable alternatives available, which avoids or minimizes potential adverse environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable and that adverse environmental impacts will be avoided or minimized to the maximum extent practicable by incorporating, as conditions, those mitigation measures that were identified.

## **DISCUSSION OF IDENTIFIED POTENTIAL IMPACTS:**

### **1. Impacts on Land**

#### ***Impacts and evaluation summary***

- a. The Project may involve construction on slopes of 15% or greater*
- b. The Project may involve construction on land that continues for more than one year or in multiple phases.*
- c. The proposed action may result in increased erosion, whether from physical disturbance or vegetation removal.*

#### ***Mitigations/Project Design***

The EAF indicates that that just 4.1% of the site has a slope of 15% or greater. The expected disturbance is so minimal that additional mitigation or a change to the project beyond the standard design and construction practices is not necessary.

### **2. Impacts on Surface Water**

#### ***Impacts and evaluation summary***

- a. The proposed action may involve construction within or adjoining a freshwater or tidal wetland, or in the bed of banks of any other water body.*
- b. The proposed action may create turbidity in a waterbody, either from upland erosion, runoff or by disturbing bottom sediments.*
- c. The proposed action may cause soil erosion, or otherwise create greater a source of stormwater discharge that may lead to siltation or other degradation of receiving water bodies.*
- d. The proposed action may affect the water quality of any water bodies within or downstream of the site of the proposed action.*

#### ***Mitigations/Project Design***

The applicant will obtain a State Pollution Discharge Elimination System General Permit for Stormwater Discharge and follow common practices to minimize erosion and discharge during construction. In addition the project will incorporate "green infrastructure" practices such as vegetated swales, pocket wetlands, disconnected rooftop runoff, and rain gardens to control stormwater runoff in the long-term.

### **3. Impacts on Plants and Animals**

#### ***Impacts and evaluation summary***

- a. *The proposed action may substantially interfere with nesting/breeding, foraging, or over-wintering habitat for the predominant species that occupy or use the project site*

The EAF indicates that there are no endangered or threatened species that use the site, nor does it contain any rare plants or animals. The development of the site will have some impact on the deer, birds, frogs, and other non-threatened species that use it.

#### ***Mitigations/Project Design***

The development is designed to include greenspace and unimproved land at its outskirts that will continue to be used by animals. The developer also intends to preserve the federal wetland that exists on the site with a permanent conservation easement and stormwater management easement. While habitat will be reduced, the Board deems the affect on plants and animals to be negligible.

### **4. Impacts on Historic and Archaeological Resources.**

#### ***Impacts and evaluation summary***

- a. *The proposed action may occur wholly or partially within, or substantially contiguous to, an area designated as sensitive for archaeological sites on the NY State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) archaeological site inventory.*

The entire site appears to be within an archaeologically sensitive area.

#### ***Mitigations/Project Design***

The Applicant has hired the University at Buffalo Archaeological Survey to conduct a cultural resources investigation at the site.

### **5. Impacts on Energy**

#### ***Impacts and evaluation summary***

- a. *The proposed action will require the creation or extension of an energy transmission or supply system to serve more than 50 single or two-family residences or to serve a commercial or industrial use.*
- b. *The proposed action may involve heating and/or cooling of more than 100,000 square feet of building area when completed.*

#### ***Mitigations/Project Design***

The addition of 54 homes and two commercial buildings to the electric grid will have a negligible impact, and National Grid is believed to have ample capacity and infrastructure to support such additions.

### **6. Impacts on Noise, Odor, and Light**

#### ***Impacts and evaluation summary***

- a. *The proposed action may result in light shining onto adjoining properties.*
- b. *The proposed action may result in lighting creating sky-glow brighter than existing area conditions.*

#### ***Mitigations/Project Design***

This impact is deemed to be negligible and no mitigation is required, so long as the Applicant follows normal and customary industry construction practices and requires home-owners to use outdoor lighting that is dark sky friendly. No streetlights are planned within the development.

## **FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS SUPPORTING THE DECISION:**

1. The Project use will not create a substantial change in air or water quality, nor increase traffic or solid waste production.
2. The Project will not have a significant effect on wildlife or other natural resources. The area was long used for agricultural purposes and it has not been identified as a critical habitat for any threatened or endangered species.
3. The Project will not create a hazard to human health, nor cause a substantial use in the intensity of use of agricultural resources.
4. The Project will not cause a major change in the use of energy, nor attract large numbers of people to the area, nor create a material demand for future deleterious actions.
5. The Project will not impair the character or quality of historical or aesthetic resources nor impair community character. The project site is well-situated and designed with greenery around the boundaries so as to hide much of the land to be developed from the view of passersby on Route 394 and Chautauqua-Stedman Road.
6. The Project is generally consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and general community goals and will fit into the rural/agricultural neighborhood.
7. The use will not have a significant adverse impact on any of the other factors listed in 6 N.Y.C.R.R. 617(c)(1).

## **CERTIFICATION OF FINDINGS TO APPROVE:**

Having considered the Environmental Assessment Form, and having considered the preceding written facts and conclusions relied on to meet the requirements of 6 NYCRR §617.11; this Statement of Findings certifies that:

1. The Chautauqua Town Board has considered the relevant environmental impacts, facts, and conclusions disclosed in the EAF and the materials supporting the Application;
2. The Chautauqua Town Board has weighed and balanced the relevant environmental impacts with social, economic, and other considerations;
3. The requirements of SEQR have been met; and
4. Consistent with social, economic, and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives available, the action to be carried out is the one that avoids or minimizes, to the maximum extent practicable, any adverse environmental impacts disclosed in the EAF, and that adverse environmental impacts will be minimized or avoided to the maximum extent practicable by incorporating those mitigating measures that were identified as practicable.
