LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. 6-22 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW 7-90 PROVIDING FOR A MANAGEMENT SALARY PLAN FOR COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES (re: PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER)

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose.</u>

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Management Salary Plan set forth in Local Law 7-90, and as amended, to set the salary for the Public Relations Officer.

Section 2. <u>Salary Levels.</u>

The title of Public Relations Officer shall be placed in Range 5 (\$53,674 - \$82,248) of the 2022 Management Salary Plan.

Section 3. <u>Effective Date.</u>

This Local Law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. 8-22 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY SELF-INSURANCE PLAN AND PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION THEREOF PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 5 OF THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua as follows:

Section 1. The Chautauqua County Self-Insurance Plan ("Plan") provided for by Local Law 4-1984, as amended by Local Laws 3-1989, 7-1993, 4-2007, 5-2014, and 4-22, and adopted pursuant to Article 5 of the Workers' Compensation Law, is hereby amended in Section 4 to add a new subsection (c), as follows:

Section 4. (a) The County of Chautauqua shall be a participant in the Plan. The cities of Dunkirk and Jamestown, the towns and villages located within the geographical boundaries of Chautauqua County, and other eligible public entities within the County which are not members of the Plan, may elect to become participants in the Plan. Any eligible municipality or public entity electing to become a participant shall file a certified copy of the local enactment of its governing body electing to become a participant on or before the 1st day of July in any year, with membership to be effective on the 1st day of January following such election, provided, however, that the County Legislature may impose fair and equitable terms and conditions to be fulfilled by such new participant as a condition precedent to acceptance as a participant in said Plan. Any municipality or public entity which has been a participant in the plan under the terms and conditions of Local Law 4-1984, as amended, shall continue to be deemed a participant in the plan and shall not be required to file a certified copy of its election to become a participant, as aforesaid.

(b) Any participant may withdraw from the Plan, effective at the end of their fiscal year, by filing a certified copy of a local enactment of its governing body electing to withdraw by the preceding July 1 upon the condition that it agree to pay its Proportionate Share of the estimated Outstanding Liabilities of the Plan, together with an amount equal to its share of Future Administration Costs for a period of five (5) years minus a Proportionate Share of Plan Reserves at the time of its withdrawal. No later than March 31 of the year following a municipality's withdrawal from the Plan, the municipality's final Proportionate Share shall be determined by multiplying their Proportionate Share times the Plan's terminal liability as of December 31 of their final year of participation in the Plan. This payment shall be due to the Chautauqua County Plan Administrator no later than April 15 of the year following their termination from the Plan. If payment is not received by April 15, Chautauqua County may offset the amount due against the municipality's sales tax payments until the Plan is made whole. Payment of such liabilities shall be made in a lump sum or the Administrator may, with the

authorization of the County Legislature, permit said payment to be made in installments.

(c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, and subject to any further conditions imposed by the County Legislature, the Director of Finance may extend the deadlines set forth in this Section 4, and may approve alternative withdrawal terms for participants, if there is no negative financial impact on the Plan.

Section 2. This local law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, the enforcing officer of any tax district may withdraw a parcel of real property from a pending foreclosure proceeding pursuant to Section 1138 of the Real Property Tax Law ("RPTL") where it is inadvisable the tax district take title to a property, and

WHEREAS the governing body of a tax district pursuant to RPTL Section 1138 may find there is no practical method to enforce the collection of delinquent tax liens arising in the future against a particular parcel, and

WHEREAS, the governing body may direct the enforcing officer to issue a certificate of prospective cancellation, setting forth the relevant facts, and the parcel shall thereby become exempt from taxation until the governing body determines that the parcel should be restored to the taxable portion of the assessment roll; therefore be it

- (1) There is no practical method to enforce the collection of the delinquent tax liens against said parcels listed below, and that a supplementary proceeding to enforce collection of the tax would not be effective; and
- (2) There is no practical method to enforce the collection of delinquent tax liens arising in the future against said parcels listed below; and be it further

TITLE: Authorize Chautauqua County Visitors Bureau as the Local Tourist Promotion Agency for Matching Funds Program Sponsored by the New York State Division of Tourism

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature has authorized the New York State Department of Commerce to match funds expended by local and regional organizations promoting tourist travel, resorts, and vacation businesses in this State; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature has made appropriations for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, to participate in this program, the Chautauqua County Legislature must designate a not-for-profit corporation as the local tourist promotion agency for the Matching Fund Program sponsored by the New York State Division of Tourism; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature hereby designates the Chautauqua County Visitors Bureau as the local tourist promotion agency for the Matching Funds Program sponsored by the New York State Division of Tourism, and authorizes the Chautauqua County Visitors Bureau to apply for matching tourism funds, to receive such matching funds, and to represent the County of Chautauqua in tourism promotion efforts; and be it further

RESOLVED, That in making the aforesaid designation, the Chautauqua County Legislature hereby certifies that Chautauqua County Visitors Bureau has been in operation for at least three (3) years immediately prior to making this year's application; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Visitors Bureau comply with the following criteria for implementing the Matching Funds Program:

1. A dedicated bank account shall be maintained for the purposes of matching and disbursing Matching Funds provided by the New York State Division of Tourism and the corresponding local share in accordance with the Program guidelines;

2. All interest earned from the Matching Funds Program monies shall be expended for generic County advertising according to the New York State guidelines for the Program;

3. All discounts and refunds be maintained in the Matching Fund program account and be expended for generic County advertising according to the Program guidelines; and

4. Account(s) shall be reconciled monthly and at the end of the Program, and the required quarterly and annual reports be provided to the New York State Division of Tourism in accordance with the Program guidelines; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Visitors Bureau is authorized to apply for state matching funds up to \$250,000 for the period from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

WHEREAS, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) on March 11, 2021, and this legislation contains a wide array of stimulus and recovery funding designed to ensure the nation's swift economic and public health recovery from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County received an award of \$24,649,420 in ARPA funding, all of which is available for general county spending based on the Treasury Department's revenue loss formula and other guidance; and

WHEREAS, an ARPA working group consisting of the County Executive, several legislators, and several department heads worked for many months to create an ARPA Spending Plan (Plan) consisting of priority projects to address the key strategic categories as defined by the Department of Treasury, to be sustainable, and to have a County-wide impact; and

WHEREAS, the Plan, consisting of the priority projects, was thoroughly reviewed by the ARPA working group, the County Executive, and the County Legislature and was adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 202-21; and

WHEREAS, The Water/Sewer Infrastructure for Shovel-Ready Site(s) Project, identified as one of the priority projects recommended in Resolution 202-21, is ready to proceed, and budget amendments are necessary to authorize spending for the project; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the project description in the ARPA Spending Plan is amended to enable all of the following eligible uses: site infrastructure; pre-development, environmental due diligence; marketing; and site acquisition; and be it further
