#### LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. <u>1-23</u> CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

# A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW 13-22 PROVIDING FOR A MANAGEMENT SALARY PLAN FOR COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES (re: PERSONNEL TECHNICIAN)

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

- Section 1. <u>Purpose.</u> This Local Law authorizes the payment of compensation needed to recruit and retain qualified offices and employees for the County of Chautauqua, and Amends Local law 13-22, relating to the Management Salary Plan for County Officers and Employees. Appointing authorities retain the discretion to set salaries within specific ranges established hereunder, based on actual performance and not on the length of employment.
- Section 2. <u>Salary Levels.</u> The annual salary level for County officers and employees within the titles specified below shall be in accordance with the following management salary schedule. The maximum level of the salary range shall be a cap on the amount which may be paid for a full year of service.

Range 6 \$57,073-\$87,514

Personnel Technician

- Section 3. <u>Severability.</u> In the event any provisions or part of this Local Law shall for any reason be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of the Local Law.
- Section 4. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Local Law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) on March 11, 2021, and this legislation contains a wide array of stimulus and recovery funding designed to ensure the nation's swift economic and public health recovery from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County received an award of \$24,649,420 in ARPA funding, all of which is available for general county spending based on the Treasury Department's revenue loss formula and other guidance; and

WHEREAS, an ARPA working group consisting of the County Executive, several legislators, and several department heads worked for many months to create an ARPA Spending Plan (Plan) consisting of priority projects to address the key strategic categories as defined by the Department of Treasury, to be sustainable, and to have a County-wide impact; and

WHEREAS, the Plan, consisting of the priority projects, was thoroughly reviewed by the ARPA working group, the County Executive, and the County Legislature and was adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 202-21; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Services EMS Gear Project ("Project") was identified as one of the priority projects recommended in Resolution No. 202-21 and, pursuant to Resolution No. 291-21, a budget of \$121,200 was established for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the cost for the Project is \$152,173.35, which is \$30,973.35 over the original approved budget, so budget amendments are necessary to authorize additional spending for the Project and ensure its complete implementation; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make the following changes to the 2023 Adopted Budget:
