LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. 3-24 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW 13-22 PROVIDING FOR A MANAGEMENT SALARY PLAN FOR COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES (re: CORONER SUPERVISOR FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH)

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose.</u>

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Management Salary Plan set forth in Local Law 13-22, and as amended, to set the salary for Coroner Supervisor for Department of Health.

Section 2. Salary Levels.

The title of Coroner Supervisor for Department of Health shall be placed in Range 5 (\$53,674 - \$82,248) of the 2024 Management Salary Plan.

Section 3. <u>Severability.</u>

In the event any provisions or part of this Local Law shall for any reason be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of the Local Law.

Section 3. <u>Effective Date.</u>

This Local Law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. 4-24 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW 13-22 PROVIDING FOR A MANAGEMENT SALARY PLAN FOR COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES (re: LAW GRADUATE FOR CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY LAW DEPARTMENTS)

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose.</u>

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Management Salary Plan set forth in Local Law 13-22, and as amended, to set the salary for Law Graduate for the Chautauqua County Law Departments including, County Attorney, Public Defender and District Attorney.

Section 2. Salary Levels.

The title of Law Graduate for the Chautauqua County Law Departments shall be placed in Range 10 (\$70,676 - \$108,563) of the 2024 Management Salary Plan.

Section 3. <u>Severability.</u>

In the event any provisions or part of this Local Law shall for any reason be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of the Local Law.

Section 3. <u>Effective Date.</u>

This Local Law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NUMBER 5-24 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW 7-07 REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW SECTION 459-C "PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES AND LIMITED INCOMES" REAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section I. Purpose.

Pursuant to New York Real Property Tax Law Section 459-c, the County adopted as Local Law 7-07 a fifty per centum exemption from real property taxes for persons with disabilities and limited incomes. The purpose of this local law is to amend the income levels the exemption authorized pursuant to Section 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law.

Section II. Maximum Allowable Income.

Pursuant to Section 459-c(5) (a), of the New York Real Property Tax Law, the maximum income allowable for the exemption for the income tax year immediately preceding the date of making the application for the exemption shall be fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00).

Section III. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect March 1, 2024.

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose.</u>

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Management Salary Plan set forth in Local Law 13-22, and as amended, to set the salary for the County Historian.

Section 2. <u>Salary Levels.</u>

The title of County Historian shall be placed as a Management Designated Flat Salary of \$30,000.

Section 3. <u>Severability.</u>

In the event any provisions or part of this Local Law shall for any reason be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of the Local Law.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NUMBER 7-24 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY CHARTER (Amending Section 4.05)

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York, as follows:

Section I. Amendments to County Charter.

A. Section 4.05 of the Chautauqua County Charter is hereby amended as follows:

Section 4.05 Salary Commission

Not later than April 1, 2027, and at least every four (4) years thereafter, there shall be appointed a bi-partisan County Salary Commission to review and recommend the salaries of all elected officials except those whose salaries are established, directly or indirectly, by State Law. The salary of all officers elected for a fixed term shall not be increased or diminished between the date of such election and the expiration of such term except (1) in accordance with a schedule adopted prior to the time such officer was elected to office which provides higher or lower rates of compensation during said term, or (2) as otherwise mandated by the County Charter, state or federal laws, rules or regulations. Said Commission shall be composed of seven (7) citizens appointed by the County Legislature.

The Commission shall recommend to the County Executive and County Legislature, on or before November 1, 2027, and at least every four (4) years thereafter, salary adjustments for elected offices at least one (1) year prior to the general election in which that office is scheduled to be filled.

Section II. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NUMBER 8-24 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY CHARTER (Amending Section 4.06)

In the absence of a local law or charter law in effect on or before July 1 that specifically designates the salary of the County Executive, <u>County Legislators'</u>, County Sheriff, or County Clerk <u>for the following calendar year commencing in 2019</u>, the existing annual salary of the County Executive, <u>County Legislators'</u>, County Sheriff, or County Clerk (as the case may be) shall be increased in the following calendar year by a percentage equal to any percentage increase in the United States Department of Labor CPI-U for the prior calendar year.

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 864 and 872 of New York State General Municipal Law, the County of Chautauqua Industrial Development Agency (CCIDA) is authorized to issue negotiable bonds for industrial development purposes and the County is authorized to purchase such bonds; and

WHEREAS, the CCIDA has been working with the County on developing a shovel ready site in Ripley for several years, which is essential as the County lacks an adequate amount of suitable shovel-ready sites to attract outside investment; and

WHEREAS, the CCIDA received a \$5.25 Million FAST NY Empire State Development (ESD) Grant to assist with the project, which is not payable until the conclusion of the project; and

WHEREAS, because the FAST NY ESD grant will not reimburse project expenses until the conclusion of the project, the CCIDA intends to issue bonds in the amount of \$5,250,000 to fund the payment of project expenses prior to receipt of the ESD grant funds, and it is desirable and appropriate for the County to further the industrial development efforts of the CCIDA by purchasing said bonds; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive and Director of Finance are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase up to \$5,250,000 in CCIDA bonds issued for the purchase and development of the Ripley Shovel-Ready Site located on 146 acres of real property on Shortman Road in the Town of Ripley, NY, on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Term. Until CCIDA's receipt of FAST NY ESD funding
- 2. <u>Interest Rate</u>. At the County's current rate of return for a similar investment term
- 3. Other. As negotiated by the County Executive.

TITLE: Authorize Federal and State Aid Applications for the Chautauqua County Dunkirk

Airport Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP) for FY 2024-2028

BY: Public Facilities and Audit & Control Committees:

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County Dunkirk Airport is designated a national air transportation facility within the U.S. National Plan for Integrated Airport Systems ("NPIAS"); and

WHEREAS, inclusion in the NPIAS makes the Chautauqua County Dunkirk Airport eligible for Federal grant funding under the Airport Capital Improvement Program ("ACIP"), a grant-in-aid program, to assist local airport sponsors to maintain aviation facilities in exchange for certain grant assurances and obligations; and

WHEREAS, these Federal grants and the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law ("BIL") Funds, to be used through 2026, when combined with New York State Department of Transportation ("NYSDOT") matching funds provide ninety five percent (95%) of the capital expense necessary to maintain the Chautauqua County Dunkirk Airport; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature passed Discovery and Bail Reform legislation in 2020 under Criminal Procedure Law (CPL) Chapter 11-A, Part 2, Title J, Article 245. Discovery Reform requires prosecutors to share evidence in their possession soon after arraignment; well in advance of trial; and allows defendants the opportunity to review evidence prior to pleading guilty. Prosecutors are also required to share names and contract information of victims and witnesses to the defense, but were also provided with the ability to protect victims and witnesses from intimidation and coercion. Bail Reform eliminated bail for many non-violent and low-level offenses to reduce the number of people held in jail prior to trial; and

WHEREAS, the Discovery and Bail Reform laws were enacted on January 1, 2020, resulting in increased expenses for District Attorney's offices, Probation Departments, and law enforcement agencies statewide to implement these laws; and

WHEREAS; the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) has again awarded each county outside of New York City a sum of money to be used to offset the increased expenses associated with implementing the Discovery and Bail Reform laws. The award amount was determined by each County's average criminal court arraignments statewide; and

WHEREAS; Chautauqua County has been awarded a total of \$889,225.00 to be shared between the District Attorney's office, Probation Department, Sheriff's Office, and local police agencies in the County to assist with Discovery and Bail Reform, with priority given to the District Attorney and police agencies; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the DCJS Discovery Reform Funding Plan by the County and approval of the plan by DCJS, the County will receive the entire award in one payment. Funds can be used until they are spent in entirety, with no specified end date; and
