WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature established the North Chautauqua County Water District (District) pursuant to Article 5-A of the County Law; and

WHEREAS, upon Chautauqua County Water Agency recommendation, the Chautauqua County Legislature Established the Administrative Body for the District pursuant to Resolution 40-16, with membership consisting of the Mayor of the Village of Brocton, the Supervisors of the Towns of Sheridan, Dunkirk, Pomfret and Portland, the Chairman of the North County Industrial Water District No. 1, and three (3) additional members to be appointed by the Chautauqua County Legislature (District Board); and

WHEREAS, Resolution 219-23 increased District Board membership to eleven (11) members by the addition of Legislators from Legislative Districts 2 and 7; and

WHEREAS, the District will from time to time have contracts and transactions with the municipalities represented by District Board members and with an inter-municipal operating group, known as CBI Water Works (CBI), which is comprised of municipalities represented by District Board members; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Local Law 11-23, the County's Code of Ethics, District Board members may be unable to participate in certain District matters due to having a prohibited conflict of interest; and

WHEREAS, District Board members may prefer to abstain from participating in a particular matter to avoid an appearance of impropriety, even when such participation would not constitute a technical violation of a State or County ethics law; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That for matters on which one or more District Board members has a conflict of interest under the County's Code of Ethics or prefers to abstain from participation to avoid an appearance of impropriety, a quorum for purposes of transacting business constitutes a majority of those District Board members who do not have a conflict of interest and who have not so abstained.

WHEREAS, inclusion in the NPIAS makes the Chautauqua County Dunkirk Airport eligible for Federal grant funding under the Airport Capital Improvement Program ("ACIP"), a grant-in-aid program, to assist local airport sponsors to maintain aviation facilities in exchange for certain grant assurances and obligations; and

WHEREAS, these Federal grants and the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law ("BIL") Funds, to be used through 2026, when combined with New York State Department of Transportation ("NYSDOT") matching funds provide ninety five percent (95%) of the capital expense necessary to maintain the Chautauqua County Dunkirk Airport; and

WHEREAS, the NYSDOT also offers grant funding opportunities separate from Federal grant programs, which may be suitable for some projects and will provide up to ninety percent (90%) of the capital expense necessary for accepted projects; and

WHEREAS, the County of Chautauqua has an established program to annually review and update the federal five-year ACIP to identify essential requirements for maintenance of airport runways, taxiways, and other facilities as outlined in the Airport Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget of Chautauqua County included appropriations to supply the local share of such grants in the past and may do so in the future; and

WHEREAS, the Airport Commission has reviewed and approved these projects; therefore be it

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York, as amended, and the regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York promulgated thereunder (collectively referred to hereinafter as "SEQRA"), the County Legislative body is required to make a determination whether the "action" (as said quoted term is defined in SEQRA) to be taken by the Airport may have a "significant impact on the environment" (as said quoted term is utilized in SEQRA); and

WHEREAS, the Project has been classified as a "Type I Action" as defined by the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) in 6 NYCRR Part 617.4; and

WHEREAS, the Manager of Airports sent a letter and Part 1 of a Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF) to other potentially "Interested Agencies" and "Involved Agencies" (as these terms are defined in the SEQRA Regulations found at 6 NYCRR Part 617.2), indicating the County Legislative body's desire to serve as the "Lead Agency" (as this quoted term is defined in the SEQRA Regulations) and to complete a coordinated review of the Project (in accordance with 6 NYCRR Part 617.6); and

WHEREAS, responses from Interested and Involved Agencies were requested, and each of the potentially Interested and Involved Agencies raised no objections to, the County Legislative body serving as Lead Agency for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Airport Manager has prepared and submitted to the County a Full Environmental Assessment Form (the "FEAF"), Parts 1, 2, and 3 with respect to the Project, a copy of which is attached here as Exhibit A, with a copy of the Full EAF, Parts 1, 2, and 3 on file at the office of the Airport Manager; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That:

- (1) The County Legislative body hereby establishes itself as Lead Agency for the Project; and
- (2) The County Legislative body makes the following findings and determinations with respect to the Project pursuant to SEQRA:
  - (A) Based upon an examination of the FEAF and other available supporting information, and considering both the magnitude and importance of each relevant area of environmental concern, and based further upon the County Legislative body's knowledge of the area surrounding the Project, the County Legislative body makes the determination that the Project will not have a significant adverse environmental impact and that the Project will not require the preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Statement; and
  - (B) As a consequence of such findings and declaration, and in compliance with the requirements of SEQRA, the County Legislative body, as Lead Agency, hereby directs the County Executive to sign the FEAF Part 3 Determination of Significance indicating that a Negative Declaration has been issued for the Project; this Resolution shall take effect immediately and will be properly noticed; and
