RESOLUTION NO. TITLE: Authorize Use of Chautauqua County 2% Occupancy Tax Reserve Funds for Removal of Damaged Steel Dock Structures from Dunkirk Harbor BY: Planning and Economic Development and Audit & Control Committees: AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.: WHEREAS, Lake Erie is an invaluable asset to Chautauqua County and is the source water for the North Chautauqua County Water District; and WHEREAS, historically high Lake Erie water levels and severe weather events during 2019, 2020 and 2021 resulted severe damage to steel dock structures in Dunkirk Harbor; and WHEREAS, the damaged steel dock structures were a public safety hazard, limited the Harbor's potential for development, and had to be removed; and WHEREAS, the removal of the structures is consistent with the City's comprehensive and waterfront planning efforts, Chautauqua County's Local Waterfront Revitalization Program strategy and will enhance the development potential of the Chadwick Bay Marina and adjoining commercial properties; and WHEREAS, in July 2023 the Lake Erie Management Commission unanimously approved a \$12,000 contribution to support removal of the structures; and WHEREAS, in January, 2024 the City of Dunkirk utilized the services of a marine contractor to remove the structures at a total cost of \$107,500; and WHEREAS, in February 2024 the City of Dunkirk requested \$50,000 from Chautauqua County's 2% Occupancy Tax Reserve for partial reimbursement of the cost to remove the damaged dock structures; and WHEREAS, the 2% Occupancy Tax Program Reserve has a designated balance of \$375,532 for projects of special opportunity and need; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature designates \$50,000 from the 2% Occupancy Tax Program Reserve to reimburse a portion of the City of Dunkirk's costs to remove the structures; and be it further RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into any and all contracts necessary to implement the terms of this Resolution; and be it further RESOLVED, That the Fund Balance be appropriated as follows: **INCREASE THE USE OF FUND BALANCE:** A.----.889.WATR Reserved Fund Balance-MISC RES: Lakes & Watrway \$50,000 ; and be it further RESOLVED, That the Director of Finance is authorized and directed to make the following amendment to the 2024 Adopted Budget: **INCREASE APPROPRIATION ACCOUNT:** A.8020.WTRS.4 Contractual—Planning, Watershed Administration \$50,000

TITLE: Amend 2024 Budget to Accept NYSDEC Grant Funds and Designate Local

Match for Bemus Creek Nonpoint Source Planning Grant

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, Chautauqua Lake is an invaluable asset to Chautauqua County but has been designated as an impaired water body and its health and usability are threatened by tributary flooding; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County, after thorough consideration of tributary flooding associated with Bemus Creek watershed, has hereby determined that a Sediment and Debris Management Plan is desirable and is in the public interest (the Project); and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Development (CCDPD) partnered with the Chautauqua Lake and Watershed Management Alliance (Alliance) to submit a grant application to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's (NYSDEC) Nonpoint Source Planning Grant program to assist with funding the development of a Sediment and Debris Management Plan for Bemus Creek, the total Project cost of which is \$55,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 199-23, the Chautauqua County Legislature obligated \$5,000 from the 2% Occupancy Tax Reserve to fulfill the 10% local match requirement for the grant, but no amendments were made at that time and the match was not included in the 2024 Adopted Budget; and

WHEREAS, the NYSDEC awarded Chautauqua County \$50,000 for 90% of the Project costs with a requirement for 10% local match of \$5,000; and

WHEREAS, the 2% Occupancy Tax Reserve has an undesignated balance of \$319,952; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) applies if an agency funds or directly undertakes an action; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 6 NYCRR §617.2(v) Chautauqua County is the Lead Agency due to its decision to fund and undertake planning and policy making activities that may affect the environment and commit the agency to a definite course of future decisions; and

WHEREAS, the CCDPD has prepared the Short Environmental Assessment Form (SEAF) for development of a Sediment and Debris Management Plan for Bemus Creek and determined that the Action is classified as Type 2 Action under 6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(27); now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature accepts the NYSDEC Nonpoint Source Planning Grant award in the amount of \$50,000 and designates up to \$5,000 from the 2% Occupancy Tax Reserve for the Project; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into any and all contracts necessary to implement the terms of this resolution; and be it further

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County continues to see an increase in the frequency and severity of storm events, flooding, drought, and other weather hazards; and

WHEREAS, New York State Department of State Office of Planning and Development and Community Infrastructure offers grants to support the creation of countywide resiliency plans that primarily address extreme weather risks and vulnerabilities associated with an increase in frequency and severity of storm and precipitation events; sea-level rise; storm surge; flooding; drought; extreme heat; and other climate hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Development was awarded a \$144,000 grant (CFA #126891) from the New York State Department of State (NYSDOS) Smart Growth Program Countywide Resiliency Planning Program; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the project is estimated to be \$160,000, funded 90%, or \$144,000, from the NYSDOS Smart Growth Program Countywide Resiliency Planning Program and 10%, or \$16,000, from the Department of Planning and Development's budget; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized to officially accept the NYSDOS funding, and execute all agreements necessary to implement the Chautauqua County Countywide Resiliency Plan; and be it further

TITLE: Designate Chautauqua County as Lead Agency Responsible for State Environmental

Quality Review of State Funded Snowmobile Trail Updates for 2024

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 185-12, Chautauqua County acts as the local sponsor for the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation (NYS OPRHP) New York State Snowmobile Trails Grant-in-Aid Program (Program); and

WHEREAS, the Program requires individual participating snowmobile clubs to update the Global Positioning System (GPS) data for their trails at a minimum of every three years; and

WHEREAS, the Program recommends that snowmobile clubs stagger their GPS data collection efforts, resulting in updates every year to be processed by the Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Development; and

WHEREAS, the State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) requires reroutes or expansions of the existing trail system to have an environmental assessment; and

WHEREAS, the following trails are required to be updated with anticipated SEQR to be

completed if reroutes were made to the existing trails; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature is responsible for the Chautauqua County Agricultural Districts; and

AT THE REQUEST OF:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 150-22, Chautauqua County is authorized to conduct a coordinated review for purposes of conducting State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) for actions taken under the Agricultural District Law, and the use of the short environmental assessment form for agricultural districts; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617 of the implementing regulations pertaining to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act of the Environmental Conservation Law, the Chautauqua County Legislature, as lead agency, must evaluate the environmental impact of modifying the Chautauqua County's agricultural district boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the modifications of an agricultural district's boundaries is considered an unlisted action and as such the criteria of 6 NYCRR §617.7 must be used to determine the degree of environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Development has prepared a short Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) for agricultural districts for consideration by the Chautauqua County Legislature with said EAF indicating that the probability of any adverse impact of proposed modifications to the agricultural districts is very low; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature has reviewed the EAF and supporting documentation, copies of which are attached; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature has determined that the modification of the agricultural district boundaries in Chautauqua County Agricultural Districts No. 1 and 8 will not have a significant impact and the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a "Negative Declaration" for the proposed action.

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature is responsible for the Chautauqua County Agricultural Districts; and

WHEREAS, Article 25-AA of the Agriculture and Markets Law authorizes the continuance and modification of agricultural districts within the County of Chautauqua, in accordance with the procedures set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 280-03, the Chautauqua County Legislature designated January 2 through January 31 as Chautauqua County's annual period for landowners to submit a request for inclusion of their land in a State-certified Agricultural District; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with NYS Agriculture and Markets Law Section 303-b, an inclusion of viable agricultural land in Chautauqua County's agricultural districts was conducted in 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature received a request to include the proposed inclusion parcels listed below into an existing agricultural district; and
