**AT THE REQUEST OF:** County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr. and Chairman Pierre Chagnon:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 859(9) of the General municipal Law, the County may, in its discretion, contract with the County of Chautauqua Industrial Development Agency ("CCIDA") to provide services relating to industrial development; and

WHEREAS, the CCIDA and County previously partnered to acquire additional property from Bush Industries to expand the Mason Industrial Park in the Town of Ellicott; and

WHEREAS, the 66 acre site, of which approximately 33 acres is developable, is prime for development, but requires additional investment in due diligence related to getting the site shovel-ready, including but not limited to: completion of State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR); preparation of boundary, topographic, and field survey; completion of phase 1A/1b Archeological Survey; threatened and endangered species environmental review; wetland delineation, report, and preliminary jurisdictional determination; traffic study; and a preliminary geotechnical analysis; and

WHEREAS, if approved by the County Legislature, the CCIDA would share 50% of the expenses of the above stated shovel-ready activities, not to exceed \$90,000 each; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with the CCIDA to provide such services, in the amount not to exceed \$90,000.00; and be it further

Occupancy Tax Reserve Funds for Lawson Boating Heritage Center Structural

Repairs

**AT THE REQUEST OF:** County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, The Lawson Boating Heritage Center on Chautauqua Lake (Center) is an invaluable asset to Chautauqua County as a tourism and recreation destination, holds a Charter for a New Museum from the New York State Education Department and is a qualified IRS Section (501)(c)(3) Not for Profit Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the Center is a part of the Chautauqua Lake shoreline, and 75 years of direct exposure to water and ice have resulted in structural deterioration the foundation, which threatens the structural integrity and usability of the Center; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost to undertake the recommended foundation repairs is approximately \$140,000; and

WHEREAS, a \$75,000 New York State Municipal Facilities Grant (Project # 26465), \$8,060 in contributions from local Charitable Foundations, \$11,600 in capital project funds from the Lawson Boating Heritage Center have been committed to the project; leaving an approximate \$45,000 funding gap; and

WHEREAS, the 2% and 3% Occupancy Tax Program Reserves have unobligated balances of \$676,348 and \$716,631, respectively, for projects of special opportunity and need; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature designates \$22,500 from the 2% Occupancy Tax Program Reserve and \$22,500 from the 3% Occupancy Tax Program Reserve to be disbursed to the Chautauqua County Soil & Water Conservation District for implementation of the remedy; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into any and all contracts necessary to implement the terms of this resolution; and be it further
